Term 2 Fundraisers:

★ **Mother's Day Raffle: Raised \$2,748 profit.**

- We are grateful for the generous donations of raffle prizes from Refinery Hair, Speedfit Duncraig, Nicha Thai Massage, Diva Boutique, Tucker Fresh IGA Carine, The Carine, Jessica Stricklan, Evolve Face Skin & Body, and Duncraig Florist. The raffle featured 17 prizes with a total value of \$1,200.
- To comply with regulations, we obtained a Standard Lottery Permit, which was applied for 14 days before the raffle, incurring a cost of \$37. The raffle was hosted on the RaffleTix platform, with a hosting fee of \$129 (4.4% of sales). To minimize costs associated with holding the event, Stripe payment processing fees were passed on to the purchasers.
- Overall this proved to be a straightforward fundraiser that required minimal volunteer time to set up and run. Given its success, we are going to organise similar raffles for Father's Day and Easter next year.

★ **Sideshow Alley Disco: Raised \$4,500 profit.** Organised by the Disco Coordinator, Niki Meredith.

- A total of 277 tickets were pre-ordered, and additional tickets were sold at the door. We had a good turnout of volunteers who played a crucial role in setting up and running the various activities during the disco. The poll we conducted in the Facebook Group to recruit volunteers proved effective. The use of wristbands streamlined the entry process and contributed to a smooth experience for attendees.
- Feedback received about the event was largely positive. Students enjoyed the theme and found the activities and prizes to be highly engaging. However, some attendees mentioned that it wasn't clear beforehand that there would be games requiring payment, resulting in some students not having enough money to participate. We take this feedback into consideration and will make it more explicit in future communications to avoid any confusion.
- Based on the responses received in the survey, disco events have emerged as one of the most popular activities among students. The Disco events' success can be attributed to the dedicated efforts of the P&C, with special recognition to our Disco Coordinator, Niki Meredith, and the committed volunteers who worked tirelessly to create a memorable experience for the students. Their hard work and enthusiasm contributed to the enjoyable atmosphere and positive feedback received. Moving forward, we are committed to organizing similar engaging events, ensuring that they continue to be a highlight for students.

★ **Walk2School / Pirate / P&C Day Breakfast: Raised \$310 profit.**

- A last-minute breakfast event was organized to bring together the various days of significance being celebrated on 19 May. To minimise costs, we collected donations from Mr Fresh Carine (apples), Woolworths Warwick (bananas), Dejaxy Carine (cinnamon scrolls), and Coles Warwick (\$50 voucher used to purchase juice boxes).
- The presence of the Mysta Barista Coffee Van added to the event, with 10% of its sales generously donated to the P&C. The feedback received from the community regarding the Coffee Van vendor was notably positive, highlighting their fast and efficient service. Based on this feedback, we will endeavour to engage them for future events to ensure a seamless and satisfying experience for attendees.
- Additionally, the availability of pirate-themed goodies proved to be highly popular, complementing the students' opportunity to wear free dresses for Pirate Day.

P&C Committee Meeting Fundraising Summary (June 2023)

★ **Change Maker Challenge** (running throughout June): **Raised \$960 at halfway point**

- The Change Maker Challenge has been effectively promoted through various channels, including posters displayed outside each classroom, sharing information on the Davallia PS P&C Facebook Page and Instagram Account, and sending messages out via Class Reps to ensure all parents and carers are informed.
- Additionally, class teachers were sent emails at the end of the first week to express gratitude for their support and provide updates on their classes' progress.
- The "Leaderboard" showcasing the funds raised by all classes will be advertised on the Facebook Page/Instagram Account and shared via email with the class teachers.
- After the Challenge, surprise prizes will be awarded to the Junior (K-Y3) class and Senior (Y4-Y6) class that raise the most money overall. Collaborating with the class teachers, we will determine the most suitable prizes for each class.

★ **End of Term Lunch - Hot Dogs** (Thursday 29 June (K1 & K2) and Friday 30 June): Organised by End of Term Lunch Coordinator, Cherraine Winch.

- As of 17 June, we have received a total of 130 orders for End of Term Lunch - Hot Dogs. The ordering period began on 8 June and will continue until 23 June.
- We are grateful to Holmesys Bakehouse (Glengarry Shopping Centre) for their donation of hotdog buns, which helps us minimize costs. Additionally, we are actively seeking other donations to further reduce expenses for this event.

★ **Tucker Fresh IGA Carine FreshConnectsRewards:**

- On 9th June Davallia PS P&C became a beneficiary of the FreshConnect Rewards program at the Tucker Fresh IGA Carine store. Through this program, shoppers can earn points for every dollar they spend by signing up online or at the store. To support Davallia PS P&C, shoppers have the option to donate all or a portion of their points by logging into their account to set up the donation. Instructions on how to do this can be found on our Facebook Page and will also be sent out in the Newsletter and via Class Reps.
- Donations are processed every quarter, ensuring that the contributions go towards supporting our school community.

★ **Assembly Cake Stalls:** In addition to our cake stall sales, we are pleased to announce the availability of reusable pouches priced at \$2 each. These pouches are an optional added extra for those who wish to purchase them. Students are not obligated to buy them, and regular bags will still be offered for their convenience. This initiative emphasises the P&C's commitment to promoting sustainability.

★ **Added Extras:** Coffee van available at our Assembly Cake Stalls and Sporting events. This service will be provided at no cost to the P&C, and we are grateful that 10% of the sales made by the coffee van will be donated towards our fundraising efforts. This initiative aims to provide parents and carers with a convenient refreshment option while watching their child's assembly and in turn, it supports our fundraising goals.

Fundraising Communication Strategy

The P&C has successfully implemented an effective communication strategy by creating "What's On" summary visuals for the past two months. These visuals serve as a valuable resource for parents and carers, offering a comprehensive overview of upcoming events and initiatives organized by the P&C for the following month. The introduction of these visuals has received positive feedback from the school community, enabling families to plan and actively participate in various activities. This transparent approach has not only enhanced engagement but also ensured that everyone is well informed about the events and opportunities provided by the P&C each month. Furthermore, a similar strategy has been employed to provide fundraising updates and celebrate the accomplishment of fundraising goals. This comprehensive communication approach reinforces P&C's commitment to keeping the school community informed and involved.
